



INTRODUCTION AND METHODOLOGICAL NOTES

The European Neighbourhood Policy (ENP)

The European Neighbourhood Policy was set up in 2003 with the aim of developing an increasingly close relationship between the enlarged European Union (EU) and its immediate southern and eastern neighbours by land or sea, with whom there are many common interests. The European Neighbourhood Policy was developed to complement the EU's 2004 enlargement, with the objective of strengthening prosperity, stability and security for all concerned.

Through the ENP, the EU offers its neighbours a privileged relationship, building upon a mutual commitment to common values: democracy and human rights, rule of law, good governance, market economy principles and sustainable development.

With the Joint Declaration of the Prague Eastern Relationship Summit in May 2009, the EU and its eastern partners committed to a deeper bilateral engagement, the main goal of which will be to accelerate political association and further economic integration between the EU and interested partner countries through 'New Association Agreements'.

Regarding southern partners, the cooperation was renewed, given fresh impetus and renamed "Union for the Mediterranean" at the Paris Summit in July 2008. Heads of State and Government agreed to build upon and reinforce the successful elements of the 'Barcelona Process' by upgrading their relations, incorporating more co-ownership into their multilateral cooperation framework and delivering concrete benefits for the citizens of the region.

The central element of the European Neighbourhood Policy is the bilateral ENP Action Plans agreed between the EU and each partner. These plans set out an agenda of political and economic reforms with short and medium-term priorities. At present, implementation of ENP Action Plans is underway with Israel, Jordan, Moldova, Morocco, the Palestinian Authority, Tunisia and Ukraine (agreements having been reached in 2005), as well as with Armenia, Azerbaijan and Georgia (agreements being reached in 2006) and with Egypt and Lebanon (both in 2007). No Action Plans have yet been agreed with Algeria, Belarus and Syria. The European Neighbourhood and Partnership Instrument (ENPI) is the financial instrument that supports the ENP through concrete assistance actions. It supports bilateral actions (i.e. country-specific initiatives), regional actions involving two or more partner countries, cross-border cooperation (CBC), as well as cooperation between a public administration in a partner country and the equivalent institution in an EU Member State (twinning or TAIEX instruments).

Data collection

Most of the information that is presented within this leaflet has been provided by National Statistical Institutes (NSIs). The data for Armenia, Azerbaijan, Belarus, Georgia, Moldova and the Ukraine are taken from the key indicators that are collected on a regular basis by Eurostat Unit D1. The data for Algeria, Egypt, Israel, Jordan, Lebanon, Morocco, the occupied Palestinian territory, Syria and Tunisia are collected by Eurostat within the framework of the MEDSTAT project. All data presented in this publication were processed during the months of September/October 2009.

Indicator definitions

Cover ratio: Ratio of the export value of goods to the import value of goods.

Employment rate: Proportion of the population aged 15 to 64 that is in employment.

Exports: Transactions in goods and services (sales, barter, gifts or grants) from residents to non-residents.

External trade: Exports and imports from a state or regions' partners outside its own territory. The statistical values are generally based on the customs value.

General government debt (-) / surplus (+): Refers to the national accounts concept of consolidated general government net borrowing (-)/net lending (+) of ESA95. The general government sector (S.13 in ESA95) comprises the sub-sectors of central government, state government, local government, and social security funds.

GDP per capita: Ratio between GDP and the average population for a given year.

Imports: Transactions in goods and services (purchases, barter, gifts or grants) from non-residents to residents.

Population: Number of inhabitants in a given area as of 1st January of the year in question (or, in some cases, on 31st December of the previous year). The population data may be based on data from the most recent census, adjusted by the components of population change (the number of births and deaths, and the net result of migration into and out of the territory concerned).

SITC – Standard International Trade Classification:

- 0 Food and live animals
- 1 Beverages and tobacco
- 2 Crude materials, inedible, except fuels
- 3 Mineral fuels, lubricants and related materials
- 4 Animal and vegetable oils, fats and waxes
- 5 Chemicals and related products, n.e.s.
- 6 Manufactured goods classified chiefly by material
- 7 Machinery and transport equipment
- 8 Miscellaneous manufactured articles
- 9 Commodities and transactions not classified elsewhere in the SITC

Trade balance: The difference between the monetary value of exports and imports in an economy over a certain period of time. A positive balance of trade is known as a trade surplus; a negative balance of trade is known as a trade deficit.

Unemployment rate: The share of unemployed persons in the total number of active persons in the labour market (the labour force). Unemployment rates for men and women are expressed as a percentage of the male labour force aged 15 to 74 and the female labour force aged 15 to 74 respectively, not as a share of the total (male and female) labour force.




Percentage point change in the EU-27's share of the external trade
