Created in 1947, the United Nations Economic Commission for Europe (UNECE) aims to promote pan-European economic integration. The UNECE region comprises 56 countries in Europe, North America, the Caucasus, and Central Asia. *UNECE Countries in Figures* uses statistical indicators to give an overview of the social and economic structure of the countries and territories of this region.

This publication was prepared by the UNECE Statistical Division, and includes data collected from national and international sources of official statistics. The data are for the most recent year available, which is usually 2009. Most of these data are also available online through the UNECE Statistical Database (www.unece.org/stats/data.htm), which is regularly updated to include the latest available information.

Readers should be aware that differences in statistical methods might affect cross-country comparability, though every effort has been made to minimize the impact of this. The UNECE takes an active role in the work to harmonize definitions and methodology wherever possible. The websites of the UNECE, national statistical offices and other international organizations provide more detailed descriptions and technical notes, which can give users a greater insight into comparability issues.

I am pleased to present this publication and hope that it will help readers gain a better understanding of the socio-economic situation in countries and territories of the UNECE region.





Explanatory Notes

UNECE Countries in Figures is based on a selection of official statistics prepared by the UNECE on its member countries.

Sources

The statistical data in these profiles were extracted from the UNECE Statistical Database (www.unece.org/stats/data): an online collection of official statistics from national and international sources. Additional sources for this publication are listed on page 131.

Country and territory notes

Cyprus: Data refer to the government-controlled area, with the exceptions of area, total population and population density, which refer to the whole of Cyprus.

Denmark: Separate profiles are provided for the territories of Greenland and Faroe Islands.

France: Data do not cover the overseas territories (French Polynesia, French Southern and Antarctic Lands, Mayotte, New Caledonia, Saint Pierre and Miquelon, Wallis and Futuna). Data do not cover the overseas departments (French Guyana, Guadeloupe, Martinique, and Réunion) for the following indicators: area, life expectancy, total fertility rate, adolescent fertility rate, mean age of women at birth of first child, women in the labour force, gender pay gap, women in part-time employment, employment by occupation, unemployment rate, youth unemployment rate and economic activity rate. For other indicators the four overseas departments are included.

Georgia: In general, data do not cover the regions of Abkhazia and South Ossetia.

Guernsey (United Kingdom): Total population does not cover inhabitants of Alderney and Sark.

Israel: The coverage of the data provided by the Central Bureau of Statistics of Israel, does not always coincide with the map given in the country profiles of this publication.

The position of the United Nations on the question of Jerusalem is contained in General Assembly Resolution 181(II) of 29 November 1947, and subsequent resolutions of the General Assembly and the Security Council concerning this question.

Kosovo: United Nations Security Council Resolution 1244 (1999) provides a legal basis for the establishment, pending a final settlement, of substantial autonomy and self-government in Kosovo.

Moldova, Republic of: In general, data do not cover the region of Transnistria.

Serbia: Data do not cover Kosovo.

Comparability of data

Readers should be aware that differences in statistical methods might affect cross-country comparability, though every effort has been made to minimize the impact of this. The UNECE takes an active role in the work to harmonize definitions and methodology wherever possible. Primary sources, such as the websites of national and international statistical offices, provide more detailed statistics, descriptions, and technical notes, which can give users a greater insight into comparability issues.

Data not available

The indication 'data not available' signifies that these particular data are not currently available in the UNECE databases. It is possible that some data are available from other official sources.

GDP data

The GDP data presented by the UNECE Statistical Division in this publication are time series ready for immediate analysis. When appropriate, source segments with methodological differences have been linked and rescaled to build long consistent time series, which reflect various national practices (different base years, fixed base, chain volume linking, allocation of FISIM, etc.) as explained in methodological country notes available online through the UNECE Statistical Database (www.unece.org/stats/data).

Total and per capita estimates in US Dollars for GDP and GDP components may slightly differ for some countries from the estimates published by other national and international data sources because of differences in the population and national accounts data that were used by the UNECE secretariat and those that were provided by national authorities participating in the 2005 ICP round at the time of the comparison.

Data for GDP and its aggregates for the latest periods are preliminary and are subject to further revision by countries when more exhaustive source data for the relevant periods become available.

Time period

The data are for the most recent year available, which is usually 2009.

Units of measurement

The units of measurement are indicated in each table. The metric tonne is the standard unit of weight used. The term "billion" signifies a thousand million.








Population by age, 2009






Real GDP growth rate






Real GDP growth rate




Real GDP growth rate






Real GDP growth rate




Real GDP growth rate


Real GDP growth rate







An overseas territory is an area that is constitutionally linked to one of the UNECE member countries and does not possess full political independence. Overseas territories of UNECE member countries that meet the following criteria are included in this publication:

- the governing country is a member of the UNECE; and
- the overseas territory is located within the geographical region of the UNECE; and





Glossary

Adolescent fertility rate: Number of live births to women aged 15-19 per 1000 women aged 15-19.

Area: Area comprising land area and inland water.

Area of forest as percentage of non water land: The percentage of land area (excluding inland water) covered with forest.

Capital: Capital city of the country or territory, usually the seat of government.

Computer use: Data refer to the share of persons who have used a computer (including hand-held and palmtops) at least once in the last three months, within the population of the corresponding age and sex group.

Consumer price index: The Consumer Price Index (CPI) aims to measure the average changes over time in the general level of prices of goods and services purchased by the households for their own final consumption. The prices of a representative sample of goods and services are collected in monthly surveys and the CPI is compiled and published monthly. It is usually not revised or seasonally adjusted. To some extent, differences in compilation methods and in the coverage of goods and services, geographical area and population groups may influence the international comparability of the data.

Date joined UN: The date on which a particular country joined the United Nations.

Economic activity rate: Share of the labour force (employed + unemployed) in the total population aged 15+.

Employment: All persons (employees and self-employed) engaged in a productive activity that falls within the production boundary. It includes both the residents and the non-residents who work for resident producer units.

Exchange rate: Annual average exchange rate expressed in national currency units per US dollar. Depending on the country, the exchange rates are market rates which are largely determined by market forces, or official rates which are determined by authorities.

Exports of goods and services: Exports of goods and services consist of sales, barter, gifts or grants, of goods and services from residents to non-residents.

External debt: Gross external debt, at any given time, is the outstanding amount of those actual current, and not contingent, liabilities that require payment(s) of principal and/or interest by the debtor at some point(s) in the future and that are owed to non-residents by residents of an economy.

External trade balance or net trade: The value of exports of goods and services less imports of goods and services.

Final consumption expenditure: The final consumption expenditure consists of the expenditure, including imputed expenditure, incurred by resident households and non-profit institutions servicing households (NPISHs) on individual consumption goods and services and incurred by the general government on both individual consumption goods and services and collective consumption services.

Gender pay gap in monthly earnings: Gender pay gap in monthly earnings is the relative difference between men's and women's average monthly earnings. It reflects the differences in type of work performed and time worked. In calculating the average, a person's monthly earnings are considered regardless of the numbers hours he or she actually worked.

Gender pay gap in hourly wage rates: Gender pay gap in hourly wage rates measures the difference between men's and women's wage rates independent of the number of hours worked, the type of activity or the type of occupation.

Government ministers: High-level officers of the State entrusted with the management of a division of governmental activities.

Gross Domestic Product (GDP): Gross domestic product is an aggregate measure of production equal to the sum of the gross values added of all resident institutional units engaged in production (plus any taxes, and minus any subsidies, on products not included in the value of their outputs). It can also be defined as the sum of the final uses of goods and services (all uses except intermediate consumption) measured in purchasers' prices, less the value of imports of goods and services, or the sum of primary incomes distributed by resident producer units. GDP at market prices as measured by production, expenditure and income sides has to be identical.

GDP at current prices, in millions of US Dollars, PPP: The current price GDP of a country converted into US dollars on the basis of the purchasing power parity (PPP) of the country's currency. PPP is a method to eliminate price level differences in currency conversion of GDP. See glossary term *Purchasing power parity*.

GDP in agriculture, industry and services: Measures the produced value added in respective economic sectors. Agriculture covers agriculture, hunting, forestry and fishing; Industry comprises the production industries (including electricity, gas, and water supply), mining and quarrying and construction; Services comprise market services and non-market services.

GDP per capita: This entry shows GDP divided by annual average population.

Homicide: A homicide is intentional or unintentional killing. Intentional homicide is a death deliberately inflicted on a person by another person, including infanticide. Non-intentional homicide is a death not deliberately inflicted on a person by another person. That includes crime of manslaughter but excludes traffic accidents that result in a death of persons.

Imports of goods and services: Import of goods and services consist of purchases, barter, or receipts of gifts or grants, of goods and services by residents from non-residents.

Judges: Persons who hear and judge cases in courts of justice, instruct the jury on points of law, or pronounce judgments.

Labour force: All the persons aged 15+ who are either employed or unemployed.

Life expectancy at birth: Average number of years a newborn is expected to live, if the prevailing patterns of mortality at the time of her/his birth were to stay the same throughout her/his life.

Life expectancy at 65: Average number of years a person at the age of 65 is expected to live, if the prevailing patterns of mortality at the time when she/he has reached the age of 65 were to stay the same throughout the rest of his/her life.

Major sectors: Groupings used to measure GDP and Employment in major sectors according to the International Standard Industrial Classification of all Economic Activities (ISIC), version 3.1.

- ISIC A-B: Agriculture, hunting & forestry; fishing
- ISIC C-E: Industry, including energy
- ISIC F: Construction
- ISIC G-I: Wholesale & retail trade, repairs; hotels & restaurants; transport & communications
- ISIC J-K: Financial intermediation; real estate, renting & business activities
- ISIC L-P: Other service activities

Mean age of women at birth of first child: Weighted average of the different childbearing ages, using as weights the different age-specific fertility rates of first-order births.

Members of parliament: Persons elected to the legislative assembly of the country.

Motorway: Road, specially designed and built for motor traffic, which does not serve properties bordering on it, and which:

- (a) is provided, except at special points or temporarily, with separate carriageways for the two directions of traffic, separated from each other, either by a dividing strip not intended for traffic, or exceptionally by other means;
- (b) does not cross at level with any road, railway or tramway track, or footpath;
- (c) is specially sign-posted as a motorway and is reserved for specific categories of road motor vehicles. Entry and exit lanes of motorways are included irrespectively of the location of the sign-posts. Urban motorways are also included.

National currency: This entry identifies the national medium of exchange and its basic subunit.

Occupation groups: An occupation is a set of jobs whose main tasks and duties are characterized by a high degree of similarity. Occupations are classified according to the International Standard Classification of Occupations (ISCO-88).

Official languages: This entry provides the official languages of the country or territory.

Part-time employment: A part-time worker is an employed person whose normal hours of work are less than those of comparable full-time workers. In most countries, the distinction between part-time and full-time work is based on self-declaration. In a few countries, work is defined as part-time when the hours usually worked are below a fixed threshold.

Persons injured in road accidents: Any person, who was not killed, but sustained one or more serious or slight injuries as a result of the accident.

Persons killed in road accidents: Any person who was killed outright or who died within 30 days as a result of the accident.

Population by age: This graph provides the distribution of the population according to 5-year age groups and sex.

Population density: Average number of persons per square kilometre.

Purchasing power parity (PPP): In broad terms, PPP is the relative cost of the same representative basket of goods when valued at the domestic prices of two different countries. In other words, PPPs are the rates of currency conversion that equalize the purchasing power of different currencies. PPPs, and not exchange rates, should be used in international comparisons of GDP and its components.

Railway: Line of communication made up by rail exclusively for the use of railway vehicles. Line of communication is part of the space equipped for the execution of transport.

Real GDP growth rate: Real GDP refers to GDP at constant prices. Constant prices estimates are obtained by expressing GDP value in the prices of a base period. They are used to show the growth (percentage change over previous year) in a country's economy.

Researchers: Professionals engaged in the conception or creation of new knowledge, products, processes, methods and systems and also in the management of the projects concerned.

Territory: A territory that is constitutionally linked to one of the UNECE member countries and does not possess full political independence.

Tertiary students: Students enrolled in universities and other higher-educational institutions. Note: the reference year is that in which the academic year starts.

Total fertility rate: Average number of children that would be born alive per woman if all women lived to the end of their childbearing years and bore children according to the age-specific fertility rates of a given year.

Total population: Total mid-year or annual average population.

Unemployment: The unemployed are all the persons above a specific age who, during the reference period, were:

- a) without work, i.e. were not in paid employment or self-employment, and
- b) currently available for work, i.e. were available for paid employment or self-employment during the reference period, and
- c) seeking work, i.e. had taken specific steps in a specified reference period to seek paid employment or self-employment.

Unemployment rate: Share of the unemployed in the labour force (employed + unemployed).

UTC: Coordinated Universal Time (UTC), maintained by the Bureau International des Poids et Mesures (BIPM), is the time scale that forms the basis for the coordinated dissemination of standard frequencies and time signals.

Youth unemployment rate: Share of the young unemployed in the active population aged 15-24.
